


# St Paul's Church

Dear All

The eyes of the world seem to be focusing on the events unfolding in London this week, especially the five-mile queue that has formed to see the Queen lying-in-state. Around 400,000 people are expected to wait for up to 30 hours to pay their respects and I for one admire both their dedication and their stamina. I was very interested to see that multi-faith chaplains are there too, offering comfort and conversation, as well as prayer (if they are invited to do so). These chaplains are identifiable by their Hi-Vis vests printed with "Faith Team", and seeing pictures of these people at work has brought me a glimmer of hope in what seems like a very sombre week. We are so very used to hearing that the Church is in terminal decline and yet when momentous things like this happen, people often find themselves ill-equipped to deal with the emotions that surface, and are searching for a place to make sense of them and lay their grief. People gravitate towards places of worship at these times, as we saw ourselves last Sunday when we were able to welcome lots of new faces to St. Paul's.

If any of those people return this weekend (and I hope some of them do!), I think they're in for a treat. Being a 'week 3' service (or 'Experimental Sunday' as I like to call it), the Williams family have been helping to shape the worship and will be leading the service with me. They're being very brave as I don't think any of them have done anything like this before so please be kind and give them lots of encouragement if you're planning to turn up. We'll be looking at the parables of the lost sheep and the lost coin (postponed from last weekend) as well as the Prodigal Son, and trying to work out how these ancient stories can speak to us today.
