As we journey together through the liturgical season of Advent, we reach the third Sunday this weekend known as Gaudete Sunday (Gaudete derived from the Latin word for 'rejoice') and this day of JOY stands as a moment of respite and celebration amidst the anticipatory (and somewhat penitential) character of Advent. We shift our focus from 'The Lord is coming' to 'The Lord is near'.

Gaudete Sunday has been woven in to the rich tapestry of Christian tradition for many centuries, having originated around the same time as Advent itself, in around the 4th or 5th century. The colour associated with this day is rose or pink and so we will be lighting the pink candle on the Advent wreath. This change of colour from the usual purple of Advent is a visual clue to the faithful; it signals that we have reached a time when our reflection and repentance is balanced by the anticipation and rejoicing in the promise of redemption. As Christians, we know that our JOY is not contingent on our circumstances but is anchored in the hope and promise of Christ's coming. It is not the same thing as happiness because happiness is typically influenced by external things. JOY is internal; it can be present even in the midst of great sadness. As the theologian Henri Nouwen said, 'joy is the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved...it does not simply happen to us. We have to choose joy and keep choosing it every day.'

Gwyn will be leading the service this Sunday but if you do spot me lurking in the pews, look out for my pink, glittery dog collar, in homage to Gaudete Sunday. I have a collection of these sparkly collars in all different colours, and I wear them pretty much all the time unless I'm actually leading, preaching or presiding (when I revert to a plain white one). The collars are made and sold to raise money for the Rainbow Trust Children's Charity which supports families who have a child with a life-threatening or terminal illness, so my sparkly collars bring me JOY when I wear them, but they also help a very good cause.
