Dear all

Having lit the previous three candles on our Advent wreath, the flickering flames of HOPE, PEACE, and JOY, we prepare to light the fourth candle this Sunday, the candle of LOVE which casts its radiant light across the entire tapestry of the Advent season. In a world often riven by division, hatred and discord, LOVE is not a mere sentimental notion but a radical force that can dismantle barriers, challenge injustice, and call us into transformative relationships. As we read in 1 John 4.18, 'There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear.' LOVE is the driving force that underpins our faith and fuels our hope. It is the unifying thread that stitches together our friendships, our families and our communities.

The Christmas season invites us to widen the scope of our love, breaking down the artificial boundaries that society often imposes. It beckons us to love not just those who are like us but to extend our hearts to the marginalised, the oppressed, and even to those we consider our enemies. And these are not empty words; this week especially, in the Church, we are challenged to love one another in the face of our differences. *In a historic departure from tradition, a selection of readings and prayers of blessing for same-sex couples became available to be used legally for the first time in the Church of England.* I know that some of us will be delighted by this, others will struggle to come to terms with it but either way, let's never forget the imperative to LOVE one another whatever our differences. We need to find a way to make room for one another's deeply held beliefs with respect, dignity, and LOVE. (Whether we go ahead with these blessings at St. Paul's will be for the new incumbent to decide when he/she arrives, estimated to be around the middle of next year.)

In the narrative of Jesus' birth, we witness the embodiment of LOVE, a LOVE which is accessible to all regardless of status or circumstance. So this Advent and Christmas season, let the flame of LOVE burn brightly in our hearts and our homes, and in our church let's create a welcoming space for all who seek refuge in the transformative power of God's unending and inclusive LOVE.
