17th March is a really important day for us. The Bubble Church team will be launching the first ever Bubble Church service at St. Paul's for our parish. As well as practising, we've been very busy behind the scenes advertising on social media, arranging to go into schools and nurseries, and of course putting up the great big banner outside church (thanks to Mark and Jenny for that!). Please spread the word if you can, pick up a few of the postcards form the back of church and encourage anyone that you know with young children to come along.

Straight after Bubble Church, at the new time of 10.30am, we will have our 'Love Nature' service where eminent ecologist and ornithologist John Buckingham will be giving two twenty minutes talks on the birds in our gardens, how to identify them and what we can do to encourage them. Please do come along and support us. Jenny Clifton has put a great deal of effort into this service, and I know she'd really appreciate you being there.

In other news, Archbishop Justin has confirmed that he will be coming to the St. Paul's Community Meal and service on Maundy Thursday (28th March) at 6pm. He sincerely wants to meet the people of our parish as well as the wider deanery, and he is very keen to offer foot-washing during the service itself (at which he will also be preaching). The two-course meal promises to be delicious and I really urge you to come along and invite your friends too. It's not every day that you get a chance to be up so close and personal with the leader of the Church of England and ceremonial head of the worldwide Anglican Communion! It's likely that the event will be promoted on the St. Luke's website (as Gareth is Area Dean) and you will be able to sign up there, but we'll have a sign-up sheet in church too from this weekend to give St. Paul's people priority.
