

St Paul's Church



Dear all

There was very exciting news this week about a new walking route that launches this weekend known as the *Royal Kentish Camino*. There are three churches involved and the route is just over 23 miles long so if I'm honest, I'd probably do it in three stages if I were to tackle it (or maybe I'm just feeling a bit pooped as I write this!).

The pilgrimage begins at St, Martin's, Canterbury which is part of the World Heritage site (along with Canterbury Cathedral and St. Augustine's Abbey), and celebrates Bertha who prayed with St Augustine in her private chapel on the site, laying the foundation for the conversion of Kent to Christianity. Bertha was pivotal to her pagan husband King Ethelbert accepting Christianity and together they established the first Christian royal family in England.

The halfway point is St Mary & St Ethelburga Church, Lyminge, where recent excavations uncovered the remains of a church, dated to the time of Queen Ethelburga, daughter of Bertha. These stone foundations are evidence for what is acknowledged as one of the first Christian communities in this country.

The end of the route is St Mary & St Eanswythe, Folkestone, dedicated to Bertha's granddaughter, and

Ethelburga's niece, Princess Eanswythe, who is recorded as founding a very early Christian community in the town. Her bones have been preserved in this church ever since. Nowhere else in the British Isles is there a church preserving the relics of its founding saint, so St Eanswythe's shrine is in this sense unique.

This pilgrimage route is important in that it celebrates the achievements of three long forgotten Christian women. The new Camino also offers the chance to explore some fabulous countryside while reflecting on the significant achievements of these women who were pioneers of their faith fourteen centuries ago when it was still very new in England. I've not yet quite managed to work out how to download a map of the route but if any of you are interested in this pilgrimage, do let me know. Perhaps we could get a group together and accompany one another spiritually as well as physically?
