Dear all

As I write, it's that last of the three Rogation days this year (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday) following Rogation Sunday last week (5th May). Given the fact that we at St. Paul's are in what counts as an urban parish, you could be forgiven for not knowing much about this ancient church festival.

The word rogation comes from the Latin verb rogare, meaning 'to ask', and in a church context, what people would traditionally be asking for is a blessing for their agricultural community and protection from extremes of weather. It doesn't happen in Penenden Heath (as far as I know!) but there are certainly some rural parishes not far from here who observe the traditional procession of 'beating the bounds', praying for God's blessing upon the crops and thus the people. These days, even though the practice is almost always confined to rural areas, the prayers tend to have a wider reach, asking for God's blessing to nourish every endeavour which enables the people of the parish to flourish. Rogation is totally inclusive; it addresses all the inhabitants of a place and seeks to join everyone together in praying for their sustenance whilst committing them all to play their part in its provision.

So far, so good. I'm sure we all have images by now of village squares filled with Morris dancers, Maypoles and more cream teas than we can shake a stick at...BUT...Rogation also provides an opportunity for us to recognise that for some, our villages (and indeed towns) can be a place of *slavery* rather than *safety* where people are exploited in ever more cruel and creative ways...a far cry from God's vision (as expressed in the Bible) of healthy communities where the vulnerable are seen and provided for. As we make our individual and collective petitions to God this week, let's take some time to pray for those denied a proper place in our community. May they be properly seen, set free, and enabled to make their desires known so that they may take their precious place in the fuller unfolding of God's goodness.
