Dear all

If you were in church last Sunday, you'll have heard me say that from this weekend, albeit that it's Café Church, the liturgical colours at St. Paul's will switch to green to mark 'Ordinary Time', and this will stretch right up to late autumn.

The Church year revolves around two cycles:

- 1. The Christmas Cycle Advent, Christmas, Epiphany
- 2. The Easter Cycle Holy Week, Easter, Pentecost

The two periods of Ordinary Time stitch together these cycles, and when you read 'ordinary', don't imagine 'plain' or 'boring'. The term comes from the Latin *ordinalis* meaning numbered or ruled (like the numbers round a clock face), and it refers to the ongoing or rhythmical nature of the season. Our focus in Ordinary Time is on the life of the Church, remembering Christ's life and allowing his story to determine our actions in the world.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops puts it like this:

"Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe."

It might be helpful to bear that in mind as we steel ourselves for a few weeks of solid electioneering in the run up to the General Election. Whichever way your conscious tells you to vote, remember to let the light of Christ illuminate your thoughts and actions as we mark the time before his return.
