Dear all

Last month, I had my final 'sign off' meeting with Bishop Rose where she confirmed that I had 'fulfilled the diocesan obligations concerning the taught IME programme and parish-based training.' Essentially, what this means is that I have successfully jumped through the training and learning hoops I am required to jump through and that I have met the national standards as a minister in the Church of England. She also made it clear that although I had entered this process as a Minister in Secular Employment (an Associate role), she is happy for me to pursue roles of Incumbent status.

More important even than this were her final words in which she exhorted me not to abandon the disciplines of learning and growth. She reminded me that ordained ministers of the gospel are also disciples of Jesus, and if we are to retain the vitality of our calling, we must still engage in and be excited by learning the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven. Only in this way, she said, can we become wise stewards and teachers in our service of others.

If you know me at all, you will know that she was preaching to the converted. Nothing makes me happier than learning and devouring information, as the many delivery drivers arriving at my house each week laden with books will attest. I'd like to share with you the best book I have read in recent weeks: it's Chris Russell's *Yearning for the Vast and Endless Sea*, and I strongly recommend this to you. I met Chris during Holy Week because he is the Archbishop's Advisor on Evangelism and Witness. He has a quiet but commanding presence and so, when I came across his book, I thought I'd give it a go. If you're not a natural evangelist (and there are very few who are!), if you've ever struggled with sharing the good news of our faith, this book is for you. As he says in his introduction, before we can evangelise or even witness to others, we have to be grasped by the good news *about* the good news. He says:

"All I seek to do here is to take you to the beach, the edge of the ocean, and lift your head so that we all might live in the wonder of the beauty, goodness and truth that we find before us.

Because it is a vast and endless sea.

It is a pearl so exquisite and captivating that, having stumbled across it, we gladly give up everything to make it our own."
