Candlemass – The Presentation of Christ in the Temple

Jack Reynolds, like most of us had goals for his life. He spent most of his life not achieving his goals. Eventually he broke four world records in his lifetime and he started this at the age of 104, when he became the oldest person to get a tattoo! I will leave you to find out what other records he broke.

Luke 2.22 – 40, tells the story of Jesus being presented in the temple by his parents Mary and Joseph at 40 days old. Greeted by Simeon who exclaimed he had been waiting to see that day with his own eyes – to catch a glimpse of the promised work of God in the world. From there we get the Nunc Dimittis ~ the song of Simeon, used during the Church of England's night prayers.

We know that Anna was 84 years old, having been widowed 7 years into her marriage, now spent her widowed life fasting and praying in the temple.

Simeon and Anna lived a life similar to most of us or at least people known to us. To spend one's life waiting, in anticipation, aspiring to achieve a goal. May be to go back-packing around Asia, paragliding, a pilgrimage to the Holy Land or solve a Rubik's cube in less than a whole day!

Or maybe you are waiting, anticipating that something profound God has spoken to you will come to pass. As the days turn into weeks, weeks to months, months to year and years to decades, wondering if you had ever heard from God. May be you made a mistake or believe somehow you messed it up and missed that promise.

Likewise, many of us have had Anna moments in our lives. Hopes and dreams, everything going on swimmingly, only to see it all come crashing down by one event that changes your life completely.

Are Simeon and Anna different from us? Indeed what can we learn for our lives? We can have goals, expectations and indeed dreams, there's nothing wrong with that.

I pray that one thing on our list of goals as Christians, is to meet the Lord Jesus face to face. Whilst we are waiting, let us catch glimpses of him, whether through the pauses and silences, lyrics in songs, the arrangement of hymns, prayers said, in the breaking of bread and sharing of wine, the smiles on faces or in the beauty of nature.

Of course, if breaking records at 105 is your style, you go for it! But whether your life is remarkable or very ordinary, only one goal really matters: to see Jesus. To know him, to love him, to share him with others. Make that your goal, however young you are, and you can be sure of a life well lived, now and into eternity.
